 - National Science and Technology Council is responsible for providing advice to the Prim Minister and other Ministers on important science and technology issues facing Australia
- Commonwealth Science and Industrial Research Organisation (CSIRO) is an Australian Government statutory authority its function to carry out scientific research to benefit Australian industry and the community, and to contribute to the achievement of national objectives, including its data and digital specialist arm Data61, which has expertise in AI, robotics, cybersecurity, modelling and analytics
 - nuence Parallel Fund, is a Managed Investment Trust within the CSIRO Innovation Fund, investing in early stage deep technology startups, spinouts and SMEs with origins in the publicly funded research sector is the national public sector geoscience organisation
- GeoScience Australia: is the national public sector geoscience organisation
- ustry Innovation and Science Australia (IISA) an independent statutory board of er estors, researchers and educators that advises Government on innovation, science
- IP Australia is the entity responsible for administering Australia's IP rights system, specifically patents, trade marks, designs and plant breeder's rights
- National Reconstruction Fund Corporation (NRF) is a corporate Commonwealth entity estable to facilitate increased flows of finance into seven Government identified priority areas of the
